In Uganda this project enables people to create jewelry and other items from

handmade beads. The proceeds from the sale of these items offer a source of income to the people who make them. We hope to implement a similar program in Malawi.

In November we hosted a team from Crossings Community Church in Oklahoma City. This team had a packed schedule for the week they were here. One team member taught in a pastors' training seminar while the other members made a trip to the village to work with orphans and vulnerable children. The work site was a feeding center we support in partnership with Bridge to Malawi (Canadian

organization). While at the site the team brought the message of the Gospel to the children and spent much time in various activities that allowed direct contact with the kids: face painting, crafts, songs, races, stories, and picture taking. Each child (over 200) was able to make a craft using a mirror and a picture of themselves to take home. They were also taught the story of salvation through colored beads that were made into necklaces and bracelets.
